Defining GBV Umbrella term for: DV, IPV, FV, SV, SH +

United Nations:

- "...harmful acts directed at an individual based on their gender.
- "... rooted in gender inequality, the abuse of power and harmful norms.
- VAW is "...violence that results in, or is likely to result in, physical, sexual, mental, spiritual, economic harm or

suffering to women, including threats of violence, coercion, manipulation, exploitation or arbitrary deprivation of liberty, whether occurring in public or in private life."

"GBV is a serious violation of human rights and a lifethreatening health and protection issue."

- It may be a single act or a series of acts forming a pattern of abuse.
- Domestic violence can occur in any relationship; however, women are primarily the victims and men are primarily the perpetrators.
- Children and young people experience harm by being exposed to violence in adult relationships, being the direct victims of violence, or a combination of the two.



Stats, Costs, & Consequences

Life-long repercussions
Health, mental health, addictions
Can be lethal

In Canada:

- Half of all women experience at least one incident.
- \$ 7.4 billion per year economic costs.
- Almost 1/3 of all violent crimes.
- > Every 6 days a woman is killed.
- Risks up to 12x higher if Indigenous or African descent, or living with disability, queer/trans...




Sometimes violence is mutual and normalized.

Consider this scenario:

 "He literally sat down across from me one morning with his coffee and said if I didn't leave, he would kill me. It would just be a matter of time. I did not believe him, but I did leave, and went crying to my friends And then I went back."

- "What I didn't understand is that that shame would follow me for years, not always so prominently, but it would kind of always be there."
- "I would look at that 23-year-old in the picture of us having eloped, and I would think how naive I was. And I would be embarrassed for her, for myself. And I just felt that somehow I had played a role in it."

- "I went out of my way to hide my bruises. I went out of my way to appear like a loving couple in public. My family lived in Ontario, and I was on the east coast, so it was easy to hide it from my parents."
- " I couldn't talk about it for many years- the shame and self-blame. It was just this thing I didn't talk about it."
- "But I carried shame and self-blame, and I finally identified it, and worked through it. Then I could picture it... as a braid. A braid of shame and self-blame wrapped together with pain."
